The Student Charter is not a legally binding contract, but provides a commitment to work together in an effective, productive and inclusive partnership.

1. Student Responsibilities

As a student UCB expects you to:

- 1. Commit to the achievement of your programme of study. In so doing be punctual for lectures and work placements, attend them regularly and complete your assessments by the stated deadlines.
- 2. Seek help and guidance, including appropriate academic skills development, if you need it.
- 3. Comply with the professional values and code of ethics that are relevant to the career to which your programme relates.
- 4. Be willing to become an independent learner and to take responsibility for your learning and the work you submit for assessment.
- 5. Respect the values of others and their rights to learn and express opinions.
- 6. Communicate and behave appropriately at all times and in a manner that upholds the reputation of UCB, including within social media and on-line environments.
- 7. Pay any fees to UCB within the appropriate timescales.
- 8. Make yourself aware of, and comply with, all policies and procedures relating to students.
- 9. Take responsibility for your own health and safety and that of other people in the UCB community.
- 10. Engage with the UCB community in promoting environmental sustainability and maintaining the physical environment.
- 11. Engage with UCB to seek ways to enhance the learning and living experience of students.
- 12. Uphold professional standards and conduct.
- 13. Respect for and engage in our inclusive and diverse community at UCB.
- 14. Provide an inclusive and accessible community.

2. UCB Responsibilities

As a student you can expect UCB to:

- Provide excellent opportunities for learning and study.
- Work to maintain a safe and secure environment.
- Provide access to learning resources and facilities that help you achieve the outcomes
 of your programme of study.
- Provide timely and useful feedback on your work.
- Provide you with regular information on your progress.
- Provide opportunities to develop your academic skills and help with academic skills development.
- Provide opportunities for updating and improving your personal and employability skills including work experience, placement and volunteering.
- Provide access to a comprehensive range of services to support your learning and living.
- Provide dedicated International Student Immigration Support.
- Provide clear, accessible and fair procedures for complaints, assessment appeal and where relevant fitness to practise procedures.
- Provide systems for student representation and opportunities for you to comment on your experience and participate in its enhancement.
- Deal thoughtfully and empathetically with your requests for help, support and advice.

3. The Guild of Students' Responsibilities

As a student you can expect the Guild of Students to:

- Provide you with information and guidance on welfare, social and community issues.
- Represent you, encourage your participation and campaign on your behalf.
- Offer you a range of social, cultural, sporting and developmental opportunities.
- Hold annual democratic elections to appoint Guild Officers of your choice.

4. UCB will seek the views and suggestions of students through:

- Discussion with your programme team members and your tutors.
- The completion of satisfaction surveys.
- The election of student representatives from your programme to attend meetings to discuss the quality of programmes and services, and to provide support to the Guild of Students.
- The Guild of Students involvement in the review and management of provision and the services we provide.
- Discussion at student engagement meetings, Board of Studies and ad-hoc focus groups.
- Staff and student cocreation partnerships.
- Students and employers to cocreate the curriculum which supports the UCB community.

This Student Charter was approved by the Student Services and Standards Sub-committee of the Corporation on 14 June 2023.
