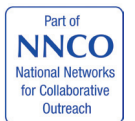

Discovering NHS Career Pathways

Join us for a day exploring the varied career opportunities within the National Health Service (NHS). Students will undertake four different workshops to understand different career routes and necessary skills needed to work within a specific field. The event will include the following workshops:-

- **Careers in Health:** Students will discover the many pathways within the NHS by taking part in practical activities. These include taking blood from a fake arm using a real needle, recording and printing an electrocardiogram (ECG), using an iPhone to photograph a retina and fitting an intubation tube into the windpipe of a dummy.
- **Sports Therapy:** Students will get an insight into the world of sports therapy through practical activities including physiological performance testing, functional movement screening, anaerobic testing on a bike, athletic taping, manual and electro therapy.
- **Health Careers Planning:** The range of roles within the NHS is vast. This session will focus on finding out about these careers and exploring NHS roles in more detail. Student practitioners will be delivering this workshop.
- **Exercise and Health:** Regular physical activity is central to healthy living. Students will gain an insight into the various ways we measure and promote exercise, and have a chance to use specialist equipment. Students will gain an understanding of the range of careers in sport, exercise and health promotion.
- **Midwifery:** Current academic staff and midwifery students will provide practical advice on taking manual blood pressure, urinalysis and abdominal palpation.
