INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

During your son/daughter's studies at the College, there will be occasions when he/she may be required to leave the College site as part of the learning process. This will take place normally in one or more of the following six situations:

1. Directed study/investigation at a location close to College, for example the city centre, accompanied by a lecturer.
2. Directed study/investigation at a location close to College, but not accompanied by a lecturer. In this situation, students would be instructed to work in small groups and then report back their findings in the classroom.
3. A day visit (normally coach/mini-bus travel) to a destination relevant to the vocational area of the programme. Accompanied by lecturer(s).
4. A residential educational visit. In the first year, normally 2-3 nights away from home; in the second year up to 7 nights. Accompanied by lecturers. Full details of residential visits are always posted to parents/guardians in advance of the trip.
5. A period of industrial placement (non-residential) accompanied or not by lecturers – depending on arrangements.
6. A period of industrial placement (residential) accompanied by lecturers – full details are sent out to parents/guardians in advance.
