Self-referral options are commonly available, and many services offer single points of access. This means there is a single set of contact information through which all queries and referrals are channelled through.

Provided through Forward Thinking Birmingham, Silvercloud is an online therapy for people aged 16-25 struggling with stress, anxiety or depression. You're supported by a therapist, who provides feedback and guidance along the way, and you can complete the modules at your own pace.

Living Well Consortium

If you are 16-25 and feeling stressed, anxious, or depressed, you can get support from the Living Well Consortium. You will need to be registered with a Birmingham GP.

Birmingham Healthy Minds

An NHS psychological therapies service that works closely with Birmingham GP's. They offer advice, information and brief psychological talking therapies for people aged 16 and over, who are often feeling anxious, low in mood or depressed.

Safeguarding Concerns at UCB

All UCB staff and students have a duty to safeguard and report any concerns they have in a timely manner if:

- they are a victim of abuse
- they see something that could be abuse
- they suspect that abuse has occurred, or may do

This should be reported to the Designated/Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads.

Abuse Survivors Clinic ASC is a dedicated clinic offering specialised services to support anyone aged 13 or over who has been affected by sexual violence or abuse at any time in their lives. Information for Partners Established in 1999, Kairos WWT supports women at risk of or subjected to sexual exploitation, as they journey towards safety, stability and self belief. We provide holistic, non-judgemental, trauma informed, and woman centred services.

Our mission is to: Increase the safety, stability and self-belief of women in Coventry affected by or at risk of exploitation through emotional and practical support, advocacy and awareness raising. some crossover with criminal exploitation with this cohort.

The drop-in provision currently takes place at St. Mary's Church on Raglan St. Evening drop-in provides a safe space for women involved in street-based prostitution to have a hot drink, a chat, report incidents of violence/sexual violence, receive harm reduction materials, and learn about services at Kairos WWT (and other providers)

It can take time for women to build up enough trust to engage with us at outreach and/or dropin and then often takes further time before a woman is ready to selfrefer into our wider services offer • We are looking to expand our outreach/drop-in offer to a Friday evening. Our service offer continued As part of our service offer described thus far, we provide:

Crisis support and provision of essentials such as clothing, toiletries, harm reduction kits (condoms, needles etc.), food bank vouchers etc.

A safe space to be heard regarding historical and current trauma. Women can disclose childhood abuse, domestic violence/abuse, coercive and controlling relationships, sexual violence, trafficking, exploitation, and other crimes perpetrated against them. We provide them with options such as accessing the Sexual Health Referral Centre (SARC), accessing an Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (ISVA) or Independent Domestic Violence (IDVA) service, completing Ugly Mugs reports, reporting directly to the Police, access to counselling and/or choosing to pursue no further action. We facilitate referrals to and support the woman's engagement with specialist services.

As part of Coventry Women's Partnership, we offer referral pathways for women to access Coventry Haven Women's Aid, Coventry Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre (CRASAC), Foleshill Women's Training and Coventry Law Centre

Base 25 can be accessed through our city centre base, outreach locations, community venues/schools, detached youth workers, digital platforms, e-mail or telephone. Below are support services provided:

Empower - Our Empower approach places the child or young person's voice at the centre of any package of support and a programme is co-produced to meet individual needs. Often the work focuses on learning around themes such as online grooming, gangs, relationships and protective behaviours.

Specialist Mentoring - Our specialist mentoring uses a unique approach to support the positive engagement of those at risk of exploitation, youth violence and gangs. Through a creative process of supporting the child or young person to tell their story (as with our iGirl approach) or using sport as a tool to encourage engagement, our specialist mentoring uses positive role models to support positive change.

Clued Up - This is our specialist group work approach for those at risk of exploitation, youth violence and gangs. It focuses on early intervention that will benefit those that prefer to learn alongside their peers. Each programme can be tailored to meet individual and group needs so it has the flexibility to cover a broad range of themes.

British Red Cross provides destitution support to asylum seekers in the West Midlands. They also provide casework support to unaccompanied asylum seeking young people up to the age of 25. They have an internal anti-trafficking team who provide remote advice on cases and can occasionally provide emergency response support dependent on capacity.

Our UK crisis response teams set up reception centres for exploited and potentially trafficked people. These are open once local police or the National Crime Agency (NCA) identify people in need. The centres are open 24 hours a day for a short-term period. Inside, we:

- provide emergency provisions such as food, clothes and blankets
- offer a listening ear and emotional support
- give first aid.


