Resits	A student eligible to make another attempt at their assessment with a capped mark (undergraduate cap = 40% and postgraduate cap = 50%).
	Typically, resits are offered to students if they have passed at least half of their module credits for that level (eg 60/120 credits)
	Students who undertake a placement halfway through a programme level (for example, after semester 1) may be offered resits before starting their placement or with an extended timeframe (depending on the placement context). This will be made explicit at each relevant Exam Board.
RWA	Repeat with Attendance
	Students are typically required to RWA if they have failed more than half of their module credits (at a particular level) without any upheld ECs. In addition, students may also be required to repeat a module if they have failed a resit assessment and have insufficient credits to progress to the next level or be awarded.
FRTW/FRW	Failed Required to Withdraw
	This typically happens when a student has exhausted all of their resubmission opportunities and cannot progress or be awarded.
Progress	Progress to the next stage of the programme
Continue	Student can continue their study – applies to programmes such as part- time, HK Block, three-semester programmes, and 12-month Masters
PTD	Progress to Dissertation (this typically is a decision for a student on a Master's programme (that is longer than 12 months), and where they have successfully completed their taught programme. Such students can then progress to their master's research project (which may include a variety of project contexts)

- 2. Some programmes have must-pass assessments and/or must-pass modules this will be stated at the start of the Exam Board. PSRB programmes may have a different programme title for fallback awards. This will be communicated at the Exam Board.
- 3. Students must achieve at least 15% in all assessments for the full award (as long as the assessment is **not** a must-pass one). For fallback awards, students need to achieve at least 15% in all assessments for the modules **contributing** to this fallback award.
- 4. Exam Boards will have discretionary powers regarding 'compensation' at undergraduate programmes only. These will be explained at the start of each Exam Board to ensure transparency and consistency in their application.

For Merit, 90 credits must be 60%+ (including the dissertation/project)

For Distinction, 90 credits must be 70%+ (including the dissertation/project)

Note: The project must be in the Merit or Distinction band for borderline cases only
